As Humanium's foundation and institutional development and German-speaking professional, your primary responsibilities are to develop strategies to cultivate potential grant supporters in Switzerland and Germany, to secure new grants, to maintain current foundation funding and to steward existing relationships with foundations. As a part of these responsibilities, the successful Grants Manager must create high quality, persuasive proposals and reports and help to meet all application, renewal, and reporting criteria for the institutional/foundation-related fundraising.

To start, your focus will be on creating sustainable partnerships between foundations and Humanium to develop its child rights advocacy program and child rights online education activities.

As a manager, you will lead the fundraising team composed of 2 freelancers and volunteers, and ensure the management and development of the portfolio of institutional and foundation grants for Humanium France, Switzerland and Germany.
